

Putting in the Work

Artists prepare for larger artistic projects by writing, sketching, preparing colors, and planning out the composition for their final piece. Preliminary sketches, such as this example from Paul Signac, help reveal the artist's process. You can see how this ink drawing informed the composition of the final oil painting, now at the Metropolitan Museum of Art.
